First Samuel

The Book of First Samuel describes the transition of leadership from judges to kings. Three characters are prominent in this book: Samuel, the last judge; Saul, the first king of Israel; and David, who is anointed in this book, but does not officially become king until 2 Samuel.

First Samuel covers the approximately 94-year period from the birth of Samuel to the death of Saul (about 1105 B.C. to 1011 B.C.).

The simplest way to divide this book is into two parts: 1) Samuel, the Last Judge (1-7); 2) Saul, the First King (8-31). David will first enter the picture in ch. 16.

You could also break it down into three parts: 1) Samuel and the Last Days of the Judges (1-7); The Kingdom of Saul Until His Rejection (8-15); The Decline of Saul's Kingdom (16-31)
