# We are “His workmanship” (2:10)

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- ❑ Yes, to be saved, we had to believe, repent, confess our faith in Jesus, and be buried with Him in baptism.
  - ❑ But only God could provide the perfect sacrifice for our sins.
  - ❑ Only God could make us alive, raise us up together with Christ, and make us sit together with Christ in the heavenly places.
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# If we are “His workmanship...”

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- Then we are not the workmanship of those who taught us (as vital as their “work” may be).
    - 1 Corinthians 3:5–9.
  - And we are certainly not our OWN workmanship.
    - 1 Corinthians 15:10.

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1. The workmanship of God should bring praise to God.

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# Applications

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2. The workmanship of God must be handled with care.

- Romans 14:14–20

- Gal. 6:1–2; Col. 3:12–14; 1 Thess. 5:14

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# Applications

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3. The workmanship of God must never be content until brought to perfection.

- Phil. 1:3–7; Hebrews 13:20–21.
  - We must continue to “work out” what God “works in” (Philippians 2:12–13).
