

What Should Be My Attitude Toward This Book?

If my desire is to follow Jesus...

My attitude toward the Scriptures should be the same as His!

- Major point #1: He regarded them as inspired.
 - "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God..."
 (2 Timothy 3:16).
 - "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4).
 - Did Jesus believe this to be the case with all Scripture?

- Old Testament Scriptures inspired?
 - He spoke of how they **must be fulfilled** (Matt. 5:17–18; Luke 24:44).
 - Settled arguments with O.T. Scripture.
 - "It is written..."
 - "Have you not read?" (e.g., Matt. 22:29–32, 41–46).
 - John 10:34–35.
 - Quoted from at least 13 different O.T. books.

- New Testament Scriptures inspired?
 - The first four books contain many words spoken directly by Jesus, and so these come from the "mouth of God" (Deuteronomy 18:15-20; John 12:47-50).
 - Now, notice what Jesus promised His apostles He would do (John 14:25–26; 16:13–15).

- Major point #2: Jesus was careful to teach only that which came from the mouth of God.
 - John 7:16–18; 8:26; 12:49–50.
 - Tradition NOT on par with Scripture: Matthew 15:7-9.
 - And let's never doubt the power of this source (e.g., Luke 24:25–27, 32).

- Major point #3: Jesus insisted the Scriptures should be read and could be understood.
 - On the need to READ the Scriptures...
 - "Have you never read?" (Matt. 12:3, 5; 19:4; 21:16, 42; 22:31).
 - "You are mistaken, not knowing the Scriptures" (Matt. 22:29).
 - Jesus made an argument based on a single word in a passage (John 10:33-36), another on the tense of a word (Matt. 22:29-31).

- Major point #3: Jesus insisted the Scriptures should be read and could be understood.
 - On our ability to UNDERSTAND the Scriptures...
 - "Hear and understand..." (Matthew 15:10).
 - "He who received seed on the ground is he who hears the word and **understands** it, who bears fruit and produces" (Matthew 13:23).
 - Why we sometimes don't: Matthew 13:13–15.

- Major point #4: Jesus insisted on strict obedience to God's word.
 - It expresses our love for Him. John 14:21, 23–24.
 - It shows respect for His authority. Matthew 28:18-20.
 - It is essential to our salvation. Matthew 7:21-23.

How, then, do we treat the Scriptures?

- We regard them, not as the words of men, but as the words of God.
- We teach as doctrine only that which can be proven from Scripture.
- We very thoroughly read the Scriptures, confident that we can understand God's will for us.
- We diligently strive to do all He commands in Scripture—we are here to do His will, not our own.
